<b>Prerequisites:</b>	
<b>Conditions for course completion:</b> The evaluation is based on a combination of continuous control on the exercises. Continuous control of the exercises is carried out during the teaching part of the exercises in the form of a test aimed at verifying the student's practical skills with a share of 20% of the final assessment. Lectures are conducted in the form of interactive presentations with interactive discussion and exchange of views between the teacher and students. After completing the first block of lectures (territorial development, settlement development, territorial and administrative development, population, settlements of the SR), the first written examination (40%) will take place, and after the second block (production and non-production sphere of the SR), a second written examination will be carried out during the examination period (40%). Both written reviews form an exam, the weight of which is 80% in the final evaluation. The resulting assessment is a weighted average of the assessment from the interim control (20%) and the exam (80%). Credits will only be awarded to a student who achieves a grade of at least 51% in each part of the assessment - exercises and both written examinations. The final assessment is the sum of points from the continuous assessment (exercises) and the exam: A – 91-100 points, B – 81-90 points, C – 71-80 points, D – 61-70 points, E – 51- 60 b., FX – less than 50 b.	
<b>Learning outcomes:</b> The aim of the course is to provide Knowledge: Students will acquire comprehensive knowledge of individual areas of human geography within Slovakia as a whole and in its regions. The student will get to know key information from the area of HG SR and also the basic spatial differentiation of the investigated HG phenomena in the regions of Slovakia. Graduates of the course will gain up-to-date knowledge about the current state and development of economic sectors in Slovakia. Skills: After successfully completing this subject, the student will be able to identify the basic principles and regularities of the distribution of the population, settlements and economic sectors in Slovakia. Can use basic methods used in geography to evaluate basic demographic and economic indicators available for the Slovak Republic. Competences: The student is able to conduct independent and team professional work. He is able to apply the geographical methods he became familiar with during his studies to evaluate the distribution and development of selected HG phenomena in a specific territory within the Slovak Republic. On the basis of appropriate documents, the student is able to develop an analysis of the current situation and also forecasts of the future development of selected demographic and economic indicators for the Slovak Republic.
