<b>Conditions for course completion:</b> The awarding of the final evaluation to the student is conditional on active participation in the exercises, part of which is carried out in the field (max. 2 absences, participation in field training is mandatory in full). The final assessment will be given to the student based on the level of mastery of work with selected methods of human geographic research. He will demonstrate this in the form of a final report from the exercises, to which he will also attach the compiled databases. To obtain an overall grade A, it is necessary to obtain a weighted average of three parts of the grade of 90% or more, for grade B it is 80%, for grade C 70%, for D 60% and for E 50%. Credits will not be granted to a student who scores less than 50 in any part of the assessment, or does not reach the overall evaluation level of at least 50%.	
<b>Learning outcomes:</b> <b>Knowledge:</b> The student is acquainted with the basic methods of human geographic research, including data collection, analysis, evaluation and interpretation. The student understands what methods can be used for specific research goals. <b>Skills:</b> The student is oriented in the applicability of various methods in human geographic research and is able to compile a methodological framework for a specific research goal. During the course, the student gained practical experience with selected methods of data collection, analysis and evaluation. <b>Competences:</b> The student is competent to independently compile a methodological framework for specific human geographic research. Thanks to practical experience with the application of selected methods, he has an overview of their time intensity, thanks to which he is able to better manage the time management of the research	
<b>Brief outline of the course:</b> Students will become familiar with the planning of human geographic research, methods of data collection, analysis, and interpretation. They learn to work with selected data collection methods through exercises in the field. As part of their independent work, they subsequently analyze and graphically interpret the data obtained based on the instruction.
