Basic conditions for admission

The applicant must have completed their studies in an accredited psychology bachelor's study programme, and the completed studies must correspond to the description of the core of the accredited psychology bachelor's study programme in the Slovak Republic.

Defining core knowledge (1st level)

Admission requirements for the master's programme in psychology for international students:

The applicant must have completed their studies in a bachelor's study programme in the field of psychology, and the completed studies must correspond to the description of the core of the accredited psychology study programme in the Slovak Republic. It concerns the main topics and skills of the field of study:

Main topics of the core knowledge of the study field (1st level)

The main topics of the knowledge core of the 1st level of higher education are tied to basic general knowledge in the field and from the theoretical (basic and special disciplines) and applied psychological disciplines, which are predominantly oriented to an individual, or psychological aspects of their behavior and experience within small social groups. The above relates mainly to knowledge from the following areas:

- History of Psychology
- General Psychology
- Cognitive Psychology
- Developmental Psychology
- Psychology of Personality
- Psychopathology
- Social Psychology
- Psychobiology
- Neuropsychology
- Psychology of Work and Organization
- Pedagogical Psychology
- School Psychology
- Clinical Psychology
- Counseling Psychology

The core knowledge of the 1st level of higher education is further linked to basic knowledge in the field of diagnostics and methodology:

- Theory and basics of psychodiagnostics
- Theory and basics of psychometrics

Methodology

- Basics of methodology (quantitative and qualitative research)
- Experimental methods
- Basics of statistics

Main topics of the core skills of the field of study (1st level)

The main topics of the core skills of the 1st level of higher education are tied to the application of basic knowledge in the field of theoretical and applied disciplines, psychological diagnostics (including psychometrics) and methodology:

- Basics of diagnostics
- Conducting interviews
- Group intervention techniques
- Designing measuring instruments
- Design and implementation of experiment and research
- Data collection
- Statistical data analysis
- Qualitative data analysis

The main topics of the 1st level of higher education are further linked to the acquisition of general academic skills in the following areas:

- Searching for information and orientation in information
- Book and bibliographic skills
- Reading and interpretation of articles
- Writing professional texts
- Ethics

Additional conditions of admission

The following documents, along with the application form, are to be submitted in English or in any other language with their official translation into Slovak or English:

- duly completed form "Application for University Study" for the academic year 2024/2025
- authenticated photocopy of the certificate and the diploma of graduation in an accredited bachelor's study programme in Psychology
- record of studies from Bachelor's degree (B.A.)
- medical certificate of the applicant's aptitude to study
- a brief CV
- affidavit of the English language proficiency level B1
- 1 photo size 3.5 x 4.5 cm
- proof of payment of the admission procedure fee

On the day of enrolment, the examination will be held in the English language in form of a written test. If the student fails to demonstrate the knowledge of English at B1 level, they will have to undergo an intensive English language course of 60 hours which will be provided by UPJŠ for a fee of €700.00. The student shall pay the fee under the instructions of FF UPJŠ, which shall not be included in the tuition fee as set out for the study in the English language.

The tuition fee per the academic year is € 5,500.

Fulfillment of the conditions of the admission procedure is evaluated by the admission committee, on the recommendation of which the dean of the faculty decides on the admission/non-admission of the applicant. The assessment of the fulfillment of the conditions of the admission procedure includes a comprehensive assessment of the documents submitted

by applicants, mainly the compatibility of the applicant's completed bachelor's study programme with the bachelor's study programme in Psychology at the Faculty of Arts of Pavol Jozef Šafárik University in Košice, or in the Slovak Republic (main topics, composition of courses, time allowance for individual courses, etc.).
