Requirements for completion

Department of Pathology

Subject: Pathological anatomy 2
Year: Third year of study, ST

Study programme: General Medicine

- 0. For registration of the subject (prerequisite for registration), a successful completion of practical lessons/seminars in the subject Pathological anatomy 1 and completion of the subject Anatomy 3 (an assessment in the range of A-E) is necessary.
- I. For successful completion/recognition of the subject (prerequisite for subject completion) and proceeding to the final exam, the following is necessary:

Successful completion of practical lessons/seminars

Successful completion of two written revision tests

Successful completion of the colloquium (practical part)

Successful completion of the subject Pathological anatomy 1

II. For successful completion of the practical lessons/seminars, the following is required:

- Mandatory 100% participation in practical lessons. Theoretical preparation for the lessons, active work with scripts (Pathology part 2) and methodical mastering of practical tasks.
- According to the Study Rules of Procedure at UPJŠ in Košice, Faculty of Medicine, Part II, Art. 12, Paragraph 8, non-participation in practical lessons shall be properly excused.
- In case of excused absence from practical lesson, the student is required to compensate practical lesson (attendence at practical lesson in presence) no later than 2 weeks after omitted practical lesson. During the semester, it is possible to compensate a maximum of three practical lessons.

III. For successful completion of the two written revision tests, it is required:

- To get an average of at least 60% from both written revision tests.
- The date of each of the two written revision tests is scheduled in advance.
- Participation in both written revision tests is mandatory. In case of unexcused absence from the revision tests, a student cannot take part in the retake credit test, in case of excused absence from the revision tests, a student will only participate in the retake credit test.
- If the student does not get the required evaluation from the written revision tests (or has an excused absence from the revision tests), the student will have the opportunity to write **two retake credit tests**, **which are in the scope of the**

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topics from the entire semester (topics of weeks 1-13), and the dates of which will be determined at the end of the summer term. It is up to the student whether he/she will take advantage of both of the scheduled dates.

- The tests are evaluated based on the number of points (%) achieved according to the Study Rules of Procedure at UPJŠ in Košice, Faculty of Medicine, Part II, Art. 13, Paragraph 4:
 - results 91 100 % are evaluated "completed A excellent",
 - results 84 90 % are evaluated "completed B very good",
 - results 75 83 % are evaluated "completed C good",
 - results 68 74 % are evaluated "completed D satisfactory",
 - results 60 67 % are evaluated "completed E sufficient".

IV. For successful completion of the colloquium, it is required:

- Correctly recognize and describe at least 2 diagnoses out of 3 that the student has chosen.
- Students choose 3 random histological preparations (slides) from among the 65 they studied during the practical lessons.
- There will be no opportunity to study histopathological slides outside the time of practical lessons. Students have a special time reserved for studying and reviewing the slides each week during their practical lesson.
- The student's participation in the colloquium during practical lessons is mandatory. In case of unexcused non-participation in the colloquium, the student cannot participate in the retake colloquium, in case of excused non-participation in the colloquium, the student will only participate in the retake colloquium.
- If the student does not get the required evaluation, the student will have the option of the two retake colloquiums, the dates of which will be determined at the end of the summer term. It is up to the student whether he/she will take advantage of both of the scheduled dates.
- V. Before admitting the student to the final exam, the student has to receive an assessment in the range of A-E in the subject Pathological Anatomy 1.
- VI. If one of the conditions is not met, the student will not proceed to the final exam in the subject. If the condition in point II is not met, the student does not continue to fulfill the conditions in points III. and IV.

VII. The final exam in pathology takes place during the examination period of the summer term.
