



## Subject: CHEMISTRY OF DENTAL MATERIALS

Study year, term: I., winter (WT)

Study programme: Dental Medicine

## I. Requirements for successful completion of the practical exercises:

- To participate in all practical exercises and the methodical mastering of all exercises.
  - preliminary examination is done during each practical exercises session, on the given week's topic (small tests or oral examination within seminars).
  - the questions in the small tests are on the topic lectured in the previous week and the exercise topic for the given week (see *Lectures and practical exercises*).
- To get **at least 60%** on average from the overall evaluation of the **student's work in the practical exercises**, which includes evaluations of the small tests, protocols, and results of practical tasks.
- In the case of an excused absence, preparation of a seminar paper in the form of a presentation (pptx or poster, 5-10 minutes) or in written form (range of 3-5 pages, used literature, Times New Roman 12, spacing 1.5) on a specified topic.
- **II. Requirements for successfully obtaining the credits** (a prerequisite for enrolling in a subsequent subject):
  - Successful completion of practical exercises (see point I.).
  - A grade of **at least 60% on average**, which is calculated from **four** values:
    - three written revision tests (15 open questions) determined for the semester (see <u>Lectures</u> <u>and practical exercises</u>),
    - and the evaluation of the student's work in the practical exercises,
    - $\cdot$  can be considered to pass the exam with a result corresponding to the scale below.
  - The student who:
    - $\cdot$  missed a revision test (maximum 1) has to take the missing test in the last week of the semester;
    - does not get the required valuation (< 60 %) or does not agree with the average grade **has to** sit a written exam in the examination period of WT.
  - The written exam consists of 30 open questions in the scope of the subject given by the curriculum.
    - $\cdot$  The student has 60 minutes to work on the questions.
    - · After completion, the written answers are evaluated by the teachers of the Department,
    - Based on the quality of the answer, the student gets 0-4 points for answering each question (the maximum number of points is 120).
    - The examining teachers perform the final evaluation by adding bonus points based on the results of practical exercises to the tests with a score of 72 or more as follows:
      - for an average percentage of 90 to 100 %: 5 points
      - for an average percentage of 80 to 89 %: 3 points
    - The final evaluation of the exam is according to the following scale:
