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2025 Sanok, Poland

From June 16 to 21, 2025, doc. This mobility program was a great opportunity to share professional experiences and gain new knowledge in the field of education and research.



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2025 Sanok, Poland

From 10 to 14 March, the Department of Nursing Care was visited by colleagues from Jan Grodek State University, Sanok, Faculty of Medical Science within the Erasmus+ programme. At the workplace of the Centre for Simulation and Virtual Medicine they trained various simulators designed for teaching in theoretical and clinical subjects and participated in the professional training of students of nursing, general medicine and general medicine.



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2025 Przemyśl, Poland

Within the Erasmus+ teaching mobility, a representative from the State University of Applied Sciences in Przemyśl visited our department from 17.2. - 20.2.2025. She got acquainted with the educational process and the scientific focus of the Department of Nursing Care of UPJŠ MF. In the Centre of Simulation and Virtual Medicine she had the opportunity to try out simulation simulators and models focused on nursing interventions.



2024 Gaziantep, Turkey

In May 2024, an Erasmus+ mobility outside the EU took place in Gaziantep, Turkey, at Hasan Kalyoncu University, Faculty of Health Sciences. The university was visited by prof. PhDr. Lucia Dimunová, PhD. and PhDr. Beáta Grešš Halász, PhD., MPH. Mutual meetings with the management of the university and the faculty were mainly focused on the exchange of information on education and project development in the field of nursing. As part of the mobility, the host country organized an international symposium, where interesting presentations of project outputs in the field of transcultural nursing, summaries of master's and doctoral students' theses were made, and common interests in projects in the context of transcultural nursing were identified.



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2024 Prague, Czech republic

Within the Erasmus+ training mobility, the staff of the Department of Nursing Care PhDr. Jana Michalková, PhD., PhDr. Jana Sušinková, PhD. and PhDr. Martina Lacková had the opportunity to gain new experience in the field of education and training of students in the study programme General Nursing and Paediatric Nursing in the conditions of the Czech Republic and to compare them with the system of education in the Slovak Republic. They visited Motol University Hospital and Motol Children's University Hospital and under the supervision of assistant professors they were acquainted with the conditions of practical training of students in model classrooms with the use of simulators as well as in clinical practice (Neurosurgical Clinic for Children and Adults).



2024 Pardubice, Czech republic

From 23.5.-31.5.2024 doc. PhDr. Mária Sováriová Soósová, PhD. and PhDr. Renáta Suchanová, PhD. participated in the ERASMUS+ training at the University of Pardubice. The training included participation in a seminar focused on the improvement and application of new teaching methods in preclinical and clinical settings, simulations in the simulation centre (e.g. simulation of case studies of patient care in internal medicine, instrumentation in the operating theatre) and a workshop aimed at improving the well-being and safety of students and lecturers. During the workshops, common research topics and activities in ethics, spiritual and communication aspects of care were discussed, and in internal medicine nursing, topics related to self-care, medication adherence, and quality of life for patients with cardiovascular disease or other chronic conditions were discussed.

2024 Rzeszów, Poland

The OSCE certification course was held in Rzeszów, Poland, on February 5-7, 2024. The educational activity provided theoretical knowledge and practical skills in creating and administering the OSCE exam, preparing scenarios and cards for student assessment and evaluation. The course included a workshop devoted to the preparation of the room for the assessment of interventions from a practical and technical point of view, the preparation of a simulator or standardized patient for the OSCE, as well as techniques and options for communicating with the student before, during and after the OSCE. The activity was implemented thanks to the Erasmus+ mobility programme. PhDr. Beáta Grešš Halász, PhD.,MPH participated in the programme.

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2023 Brno, Czech republic

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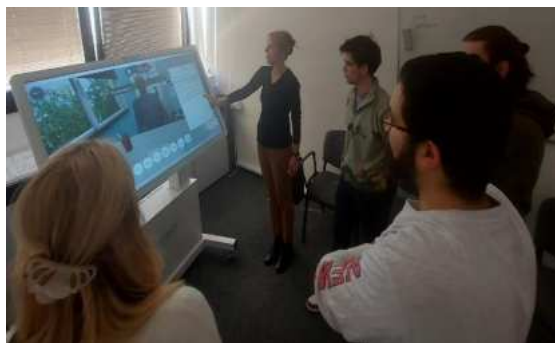
2023 Rzeszow, Poland

The programme included a visit to a local hospital in the Department of Surgery and Oncology. The visit to the simulation centre was also interesting. Colleagues exchanged experiences on the application of new methods of practical teaching of students in the field of Nursing.



2023 Rzeszow, Poland

At the turn of February and March 2023, the Department of Nursing Care welcomed university lecturers from the State University of Applied Sciences in Przemyśl, College of Medical Sciences of the University of Rzeszow, Poland, within the Erasmus+ mobility programme. During their stay, the students had the opportunity to listen to lectures on topics related to the latest first aid guidelines and practical training of simulations on Body Interact in the premises of the Centre for Simulation and Virtual Medicine. The programme also included a visit to the UNLP medical facility in Košice.



2022 České Budějovice, Czech republic

Within the Erasmus+ mobility, the Faculty of Health and Social Sciences, Institute of Obstetrics, Midwifery and Urgent Care in České Budějovice organized the International Staff Week from 22 to 26 August 2022 focused on the application of simulations in the teaching process. The event was attended by participants from Belgium, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, Ireland, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Poland, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain and Turkey. During the week, presentations were given focusing on simulations, technological support and the experiences of educational institutions that are developing or applying simulations and virtual reality in education. Ongoing workshops on topics such as debriefing, implementation of simulations in curricula, structure of intervention-oriented scenarios or case studies were beneficial. Participants evaluated the activity as very successful and in the discussion suggested international cooperation and regular meetings to exchange new experiences and thus expand the possibilities for quality education supported by simulations in undergraduate and postgraduate education.



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2022 Bjelovar, Croatia

From 30.5. - 3.6.2022 prof. PhDr. Lucia Dimunová, PhD. and PhDr. Beáta Grešš Halász, PhD., MPH visited Bjelovar University of Applied Sciences in Croatia as part of Erasmus + staff mobility. The mobility was aimed at exchange of information and knowledge regarding educational strategies in the field of nursing in Slovakia and Croatia. The aim of the mobility was to establish mutual cooperation within the framework of exchange visits of teachers and students as well as cooperation between universities at the scientific and research level.



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2022 Sanok, Poland

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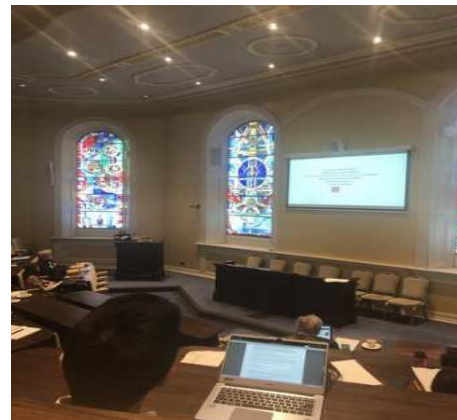
2021 Ostrava, Czech republic + Plovdiv, Bulgaria

In October 2021, the Department of Nursing Care welcomed university lecturers from the University of Ostrava, Czech Republic, and the Medical University of Plovdiv, Bulgaria, as part of the Erasmus+ mobility programme. During their stay, the second year nursing students had the opportunity to listen to lectures on topics such as quality management, pain and the specifics of nursing care for the pediatric patient. The programme also included a visit to the AGEL Košice-Šaca Hospital as one of the teaching centres of the Faculty of Medicine of the University of Applied Sciences in Košice. The excursion to the Centre of Simulator and Virtual Medicine, where students and teachers have 28 simulators for theoretical and clinical subjects, was also a stimulus for discussion and further cooperation.



2019 Dublin, Ireland

PhDr. Gabriela Štefková, completed a training activity at the RCSI (Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland) in Dublin within the Erasmus + programme from 30 April to 03 May 2019. The activity was focused on the support of project development and international cooperation.



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2018 Ostrava, Czech republic

From 26 to 29 March 2018, the Department of Nursing Care was visited by the staff of the Institute of Nursing and Midwifery, Faculty of Medicine, University of Ostrava within the Erasmus + (Staff Mobility) programme. During this mobility, topics focused on quality management and patient safety in the nursing study programme were lectured. The programme included a tour of the workplaces of the Faculty of Medicine of the UPJŠ in Košice, the University Hospital Luis Pasteur, the Children's University Hospital and the East Slovak Institute of Heart Diseases in Košice. During the visit there was a mutual transfer of knowledge in the field of teaching and research.



2017 Bucharest, Romania

From 21 to 25 November 2017 PhDr. Gabriela Štefková, participated in the Erasmus + transnational cooperation activity called Strategic Partnerships Plus "Innovation in Education" in Bucharest (Romania). The meeting was attended by 60 participants from more than 20 countries (Lithuania, Latvia, Estonia, Portugal, Spain, Malta, Canary Islands, Slovakia, Romania, Greece, France, Turkey, Macedonia, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Poland, England, Cyprus, Austria, Germany). The transnational activity focused on educational innovation and support for the development of strategic partnership projects in the countries of the European Union.



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2016 Kaunas, Lithuania

The teaching mobility under the Erasmus+ was completed by PhDr. Gabriela Štefková, in the summer semester of the academic year 2016/2017 in the Baltic country Lithuania. At the Lithuanian University of Health Science, Nursing and Care Department, Kaunas she had the opportunity to see the simulation workplaces and participate in the professional teaching of students. The stay in the host organization contributed to her personal and professional development and became an opportunity for collaboration with the Department of Nursing.



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2016 Palermo, Italy

A contact seminar entitled "European cooperation to promote intergenerational and intercultural exchange in non-formal and formal contexts" was held in Palermo, Italy, from 13 to 15 October 2016 within the Erasmus+ programme. The meeting was attended by 50 participants from 44 countries. Plenary sessions were held during the working days, in which lectures were given to provide information on various international projects in the field of education and migration. The outcome of the meetings was the acquisition of contacts at international level for possible cooperation on adult education in a multicultural context. Another outcome of the working meeting is the membership in the international organisation CESIE - European Centre of Studies and Initiatives.
