



Subject: **MEDICAL BIOCHEMISTRY 1**

Study year, Term: **II., winter (WT)**

Study programme: **General Medicine**

I. Requirements for successful completion of the practical exercises/seminars:

- Mandatory **100 %** active participation in all of the practical exercises/seminars, mastery of the theory and the methods of all practical exercises/seminars:
- In the case of an excused absence from a practical exercise session, the student will prepare seminar work in the form of a presentation (pptx or poster 5-10 min.) or in written form (in the range of 3-5 pages, including used literature, Times New Roman 12, line spacing 1.5) on a given topic.
- Evaluation of **at least 50%** in the revision test on the topics of practical exercises and seminars (**3rd revision test**).
- To get at least **60% on average** from the overall evaluation of the **student's work in the practical exercises** (e.g., accuracy in analyte determination, laboratory reports).

II. Requirements for successfully obtaining the credits (a prerequisite for enrolling in a subsequent subject):

- Successful completion of the practical exercises/seminars (paragraph I. above).
- **An average overall score of at least 60%**, calculated from **two continuous revision tests** covering the lecture topics (15 open-ended questions) scheduled for the semester, and **one test** covering the topics addressed in practical classes and seminars (see [Lectures and practical exercises](#)). The student must achieve a score of **at least 50% in each individual continuous revision test**.
- The student who:
 - misses a revision test (maximum 1) for serious reasons, **has to take the missing test** in the last week of the semester;
 - fails to achieve **an average overall score of 60%**, or who does not achieve **at least 50%** in each individual test, has to take a **retake test** covering the material prescribed for the winter semester (WS) during the WS examination period. The date of the make-up test will be determined by the Head of the Department.
 - achieves a result $\geq 90\%$ on average from all revision tests (written in WT from Medical Biochemistry 1 and in ST from Medical Biochemistry 2), they can continue directly to the oral part of the final exam in ST.
- Revision tests are evaluated by the teachers of the Biochemical Department,
 - depending on the quality of the answer, the student can receive **0–4 points** for each answer,
 - the maximum possible score corresponds to **100%**,
 - the final evaluation of the subject is based on the following scale:

- The **final classification** includes the evaluation of the written revision tests and the results obtained in the practical exercises/seminars.
