



Subject: **MEDICAL CHEMISTRY**

Study year, term: **I., Winter (WT)**

Study programme: **General Medicine**

I. Requirements for successful completion of the practical exercises:

- **Mandatory 100% participation in practical exercises/seminars**, theoretical and methodical mastery of practical exercises.
- In the case of an excused absence, preparation of a seminar paper in the form of a presentation (pptx or poster, 5-10 minutes) or in written form (range of 3-5 pages, used literature, Times New Roman 12, spacing 1.5) on a specified topic.
- Evaluation of **at least 50%** in the revision test on the topics of practical exercises, seminars, and calculations (**3rd revision test**).
- To get at least **60% on average** from the overall evaluation of the **student's work in the practical exercises** (e.g., accuracy in analyte determination, laboratory reports).

II. Requirements for successfully obtaining the credits (a prerequisite for enrolling in a subsequent subject):

- Successful completion of practical exercises (see point I.).
- An **average overall score of at least 60%**, calculated from **two revision tests** on lecture topics (15 open-ended questions) scheduled for the semester and **one revision test** on the topics of exercises, seminars and calculations (see [Lectures and practical exercises](#)). The student must achieve a score of **at least 50% in each individual continuous revision test**. A rating of **at least 50% on individual tests** and an **average overall rating of at least 60%** at the same time **can be considered passing the exam**, with a result corresponding to the scale below. If the student **disagrees** with the rating, he **must take** the final written exam.
- The student who:
 - misses a revision test (maximum 1) **has to take the missing test** in the last week of the semester,
 - fails to achieve **an average overall score of 60%**, or who does not achieve **at least 50%** in each individual test, has to take a **retake test** covering the material prescribed for the winter semester (WS) during the WS examination period. The date of the make-up test will be determined by the Head of the Department.
- **The final written exam** consists of 30 open questions within the scope of the subject given by the curriculum.
 - The student has 60 minutes to work on the questions.
 - After completion, the written answers are evaluated by the teachers of the Department.
 - Based on the quality of the answers, the student gets 0-4 points for answering each question (the maximum number of points is 120).
 - The final evaluation of the exam is according to the following scale:
