


After successful completion of a comprehensive accreditation in the 2009, consideration of the University in higher education in the year 2010 mainly focused on creating a permanent system of monitoring and improving the quality of education in all the accredited study programmes. Instead of extensive generating of new study programmes and increasing the number of students, the emphasis was placed on optimizing the content and methods of implementation of the existing study programmes. The university character of study with a maximum mutual openness and connectedness of courses was supported in particular, so that the students may benefit from the widest range of offers across the university, not just within individual faculties. Particular attention in this regard has been given the third degree education programmes. Improving the quality of education, in addition to the content and organizational aspects, also required purposeful improvement of the physical infrastructure, particularly continuous modernization and variation of teaching technology, specifically exploiting the Internet and information technologies.

Being a major research institution in Slovakia, this University devoted continued attention in the year 2010 to scientific research in accordance with its mission and priorities. Given the diversity of the University faculties, priorities and direction of the research areas are defined in the annually updated long-term prospects of UPJŠ and its individual faculties, which are approved by the relevant academic boards.

The basic form of organization of research is based on teams that reach beyond the borders of institutes, faculties, and the University. The research teams are headed by eminent scientific personalities. The primary objective in creating research teams is embodied in both need for comprehensive solutions to the issues studied and competence of investigators. Funding of research activities is provided by grant funds from both national and international sources.




The University was successful in applications for non-repayable financial contributions within the calls from the European Structural Funds. In the year 2010, our efforts were targeted at successful implementation of individual projects addressed, which, as anticipated, significantly improved the scientific research infrastructure of the key research directions, in particular those at the Faculty of Science and the Faculty of Medicine.

Since 2004, the University has introduced the so-called Research Grant System for young university teachers and researchers up to 35 years of age and full-time PhD. students to enhance the education of young scientists. In the year 2010 the 4th call was declared.







The area of international relations was closely linked to educational and scientific research activities at the University. The University considered it a priority to optimize the bases for contractual cooperation with international partners, to take participation and co-participation in international grant projects, and expand the range of teaching professional disciplines in foreign languages for both international and national students at the University. It is the purpose of the University to build university centres of excellence as an incentive for the development of cooperation in the field of international relations with partners within the European Union and the U.S. (the creation of basis for 2 to 6 weeks reciprocal exchanges) and publishing relevant scientific papers which have arisen at UPJŠ in the world languages.

The University will continue to implement programmes that avow their allegiance with the European higher education milieu and to continuing cooperation and mobility at European level. It will also pay close attention to the Erasmus programme for the allocation of state subsidies, to improve the quality and volume of student and university staff mobility. It will continue in its efforts to improve the study recognition process as a European instrument to promote transparency in the educational process.







Partnerships with universities and research centres in Europe, especially on an institutional basis within the LLP / Erasmus programme remain a natural basis for international relations of UPJŠ. In the field of international cooperation, the Lifelong Learning Programme / Erasmus remains the most important programme in education, especially its decentralized mobility activities, where this University records an upward trend in all its indicators from its involvement in the year 1999. Involvement of all the University faculties in the programme, as well as increasing reciprocity within it, is a positive feature.

Students' mobility

Students' interest in passing part of their study within the Erasmus programme abroad increased in the year 2010 from 87 to 106. The number of incoming students also increased from 38 to 51.

For international Erasmus students, the University organized an intensive language course (EILC - Erasmus Intensive Language Courses) to study the Slovak language, approach the Slovak culture, and make them familiar with the academic milieu in Slovakia.

Staff mobility

In comparison with the year 2009, the number of teachers posted decreased slightly (from 50 to 41), but the interest in the mobility trainings of university staff increased significantly, within which in 2010 14 UPJŠ staff travelled to institutions abroad (in 2009: 7 employees). The total of 7 UPJŠ administrative staff participated in mobility.



The University investment plans formed an important part of its strategic objectives. In the year 2010, the University created decent premises for the University Library as a centre of scientific information in part of the premises at Moyzesova St. No. 9 in Košice. It is the aim of the University to gradually implement a comprehensive reconstruction of its buildings in the newly purchased area of the former Regional Children's Hospital in Košice from the Structural Funds resources. Construction of a modern kitchen with a restaurant-like canteen is being planned in the area of Moyzesova St. No. 9 in Košice. Since the area of Moyzesova 9 is located in close vicinity to the premises at Šrobárova 2, a partially integrated university campus will be created. The investment plans had also included thermostatic adjustment of the heating system, which was implemented in full accordance with the design t in all the buildings owned by the UPJŠ. After implementing the first phase of energy management, the second phase continued, i.e. power savings, retraining and equipping the energy sector by advanced technologies. The Faculty of Arts Dean's Office moved in the Rectorate building at Šobárova 2 in Košice in the year 2010, followed in early 2011 by the Faculty of Science Dean's Office, which contributed to better management and administration of economic and operational activities.














Subsidies from the state budget of € 22,177,508.00 were the main source of funding for Šafárik University in Košice in the year 2010. During the year 2010, budget adjustments made by the Ministry of Education, Science, Research, and Sport of the Slovak Republic totalled € 3,129, 473.03, which were designed primarily to increase the budget for research and development activities, increasing the subsidy funding for the implementation of accredited study programmes, increasing the funding for social welfare support of students, increasing the subsidy for research and development tasks supported by the Agency to Support Research and Development, increasing the funding for official development assistance, and increasing the funding to ensure mobility and commitments in the field of education. In addition to grants from the chapter of the Ministry of Education, Science, Research, and Sport of the Slovak Republic, funds were remitted to this University for current expenses also from the Ministry of Culture amounting to € 10,255.38 and from the Ministry of Health in the amount of € 50,224.72.


FM - Faculty of Medicine FPA - Faculty of Public Administration

FS - Faculty of Science FA - Faculty of Arts


FL - Faculty of Law RaUU - Rectorate and University units

The University makes use of some other resources for providing the financial backing of its activities, which it raises by its own activities. To cover the cost of university education, creative scientific research, which ranks among the priorities of UPJŠ, and also to extend the existing infrastructure, renovation of buildings and the introduction of modern information and communication technologies, UPJŠ raised some other funds outside the subsidies and from the EU Structural Funds projects, from the Norway Financial Mechanism, from the European Social Fund, and the European Regional Development Fund. UPJŠ raised still other own sources of funding from its entrepreneurial activities, the lease, tuition fees associated with the study, from donations, income from continuing education, from the sale of redundant and surplus property, and other activities.

In addition to changing the organizational-legal form of the University to a "public higher education institution", The Higher Education Act has introduced multi-source financing of public universities to increase revenues from business activities by using its own assets and rationalizing the costs. The state budget subsidy, provided under a contract between the Ministry of Finance of the Slovak Republic and this University, ahs become the basic funding resource for covering the requirements of the University. Its purpose was to finance the implementation of accredited study programmes, research and development activities, development of the University, and social welfare support to the students.


Given that the amount of subsidy depends on the number of students, number of graduates, economic demands of the curricula carried out, and classification of universities, this University has focused its attention on the trends and criteria for allocating state subsidies and adjusted its internal budget to the nationwide criteria. The University continued to avail itself of the opportunities in the year 2010 available by a variety of domestic and international grant agencies.






In the year 2010, the University employed 1,302 employees; compared to the year 2009, the number of employees increased by 13. Qualification progress of university teachers and researchers has been increasing. Compared to the year 2009, the number of associate professors rose by 5 and the number of professors rose by 3.






The University has been adequately engaged in continuing education and professional development of administrative staff and operating personnel. Employees have had the opportunity to attend training sessions in relation to legislative changes and to restore competence to those activities that can be performed only by demonstrating this capability. To improve the employees' work, the University and its components provide training courses on computer competences and language courses in the English language as the need may arise.

The University creates for its employees a working environment with the provision of computers and availability of information resources so that they may perform their work on a high level of professionalism under a contract of employment. The employees may avail themselves of the opportunities to participate in national and international conferences, seminars, national and international professional trips. In the year 2010, 3,083 professional trips were made, of which 575 were international, 1904 national, 247 those taken by students and PhD. students, 175 by external teachers, 83 international visitors, and 99 by other persons.










In the year 2010, Šafárik University had 1660 accommodation places in its own or rented accommodation establishments and a further 650 places in two accommodation establishments with external contractors. Terms and methods of allocating the places to candidates are explicitly and transparently governed by the Housing and Accommodation Rules at UPJŠ. In accordance with the latter, the whole accommodation capacity was divided among university students, regardless of what programme of study and at which of the faculties they study. The interest in accommodation in that year exceeded the capacity of the University. Still, the difference between the supply and demand was, unlike a number of Slovak universities, relatively low. Accommodation was assigned to all the applicants with severe disabilities and also to all applicants - the third level education students residing at the distance of over 40 km.

Youth hostels are equipped with canteens, snack bars, club rooms, and sports fields. The University management supports the requirements to keep the quality of accommodation improving. In the year 2010, utility facilities were replaced, locker rooms were reconstructed, broken heating fixtures were replaced, kitchenettes were equipped with new gas stoves, new furniture was purchased.

Convenient location of accommodation and catering premises near the city centre allows students and other guests accommodated in student homes varied cultural, social, and sporting use of leisure, as well as good public transport links.





In the development of information systems, deliveries of HW were implemented during the year 2010, procured under the Structural Funds. These were gradually implemented in networks, servers, etc., as required by individual investigators.

At the same time, the Primary Data Centre was created at the University Rectorate. This centre provides technical and technological environment to become the main data centre and the node network of the University of virtualized services.
